Regular nouns. Most singular nouns form the plural by adding -s. A singular noun ending in s, x, z, ch, sh makes the plural by adding -es. A singular noun ending in a consonant

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and then y makes the plural by dropping the y and adding -ies.

## *Singular and plural nouns - EF*

Singular nouns that end in 's', 'x', 'z', 'ch', 'sh', or 'ss', form the plural by adding -es. For Examples: bus – buses. bench – benches. box – boxes. dish – dishes. truss – trusses. marsh – marshes. lunch – lunches.

For the plural form of most nouns, add s. bottle – bottles; cup – cups; pencil – pencils; desk – desks; sticker – stickers; window – windows; For nouns that end in ch, x, s, or s sounds, add es. box – boxes; watch

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– watches; moss – mosses; bus – buses; For nouns ending in f or fe, change f to v and add es. wolf – wolves; wife – wives; leaf – leaves

Singular and Plural Nouns. The difference between singular and plural nouns is easy to spot. When a noun indicates one only, it is a singular noun. When a noun indicates more than one, it is plural. Singular Noun Examples. The following sentences contain singular nouns examples. The boy had a baseball in his hand. My horse prefers to wear an English saddle.

Singular and plural nouns denote the differences between one persona, place or thing, and multiple people, places, or things. Singular nouns are when there is only one. Plural nouns are when there is more than one. An 's' can be added to the end of most nouns to indicate this.

## *Singular and plural exercises - The English Classroom*

Generally, we can say that collective nouns can be singular or plural. It depends on the context of the sentence. If the members of a group act together as a unit or a whole, we use a singular verb. (we can also say that if we or speakers want to emphasize the group as a whole, we use singular verb in this situation.)

A singular noun names one person, place, thing, or idea. A plural noun names more than one person, place, thing or idea. It is important to learn the difference between singular and plural nouns. A singular noun typically goes with a singular verb and a plural noun typically goes with a plural

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verb.

1 To make regular nouns plural, add -s to the end. 2 If the singular noun ends in -s, -ss, -sh, -ch, -x, or -z, add -es to the end to make it plural. 3 In some cases, singular nouns ending in -s or -z, require that you double the -s or -z prior to adding the -es for pluralization.
